Glass Feathers inscribed with the words Friends of the MPRG

Feathers is a permanent art installation by artist supported this cause by David Wright. purchasing two feathers

Located in the baptistery of St. John's Church in Flinders, the artwork features a spiral structure from which hundreds of delicate glass feathers suspended. lt evokes а sense are breath, wind, and spirit, weightlessness, transforming the space into a peaceful sanctuary for reflection, away from the activity of the outside world.

The wider community has been invited to dedicate one or more feathers in perpetuity, with names engraved on the glass as a lasting tribute.

In exchange for this dedication, a tax-deductible donation goes towards the long-term maintenance of the building.

McCrae Homestead Visit

nother great event from the Friends of the FMPRG. The bus took 24 of us to the McCrae Homestead in McCrae. It was somewhere most of us had never been to before, even though we

live on the Mornington Peninsula.

The homestead was built in 1844 by one of the first families to settle on the Mornington Peninsula and remains one of Victorian's oldest homesteads. We had three tour guides, and learnt about the various families who lived there.







Scottish lawyer, Andrew McCrae and his artist wife Georgiana and their family, lived there from 1844 to 1851. The Burrells, a sheep farming family, lived in the homestead for the next 70 years.

The original drop slab homestead is made of local materials including Stringybark and wattle, and is a reminder of early pioneering life.

The homestead is now owned by the National Trust.

A museum and gallery has been added, where you will see many family items, including jewellery, clothing and Georgiana's original sketches, paintings and early photographs of Port Phillip. This painted a vivid picture of the European settler experience.

To finish our outing we went to the Wildflower Cafe for a delicious lunch. A wonderful day was had by everyone and, we all agreed, McCrae Homestead is well worth another visit. Sometimes we don't know what is on our own
